

#### Methodology

- Online survey
- Fielded between September 29 to October 18, 2016
- Panel sources:
   Academica StudentVu & ScholarshipsCanada
- Sampling based on provincial distribution of postsecondary students in 2013/2014 PSIS data
- Analysis was conducted in SPSS

### Of the 1,087 students we surveyed across Canada

**100%** enrolled in 1st year, Fall 2016

**74%** age 18 to 19

**65%** women

**38%** HS average of 90% or higher

**43%** HS average of 80%-89%



"Cut school funded scholarships to cut down on tuition"


"More scholarships that are available to more people, lower tuition, improve transportation to and from campuses, make living in residence possible for poor students"
