Student Satisfaction Survey

- 23,000+ undergraduate students
- Minimum 200 responses at large schools, 100 at a handful of smaller ones*
- Contacted through Scholarships Canada, universities students and administrators as well as targeted Facebook Ads



How Indigenous and non-Indigenous students rated their universities efforts to make Indigenous culture, history and language visible.

- Excellent: 33.5% for non-Indigenous vs. 44.1% for Indigenous
- Poor or Very Poor: 5.8% for non Indigenous vs. 8.2% for Indigenous

What matters when choosing a university ...

- Cost of Tuition (More than cost of living)
- Reputation in a particular program (more than overall reputation)
- Location in a particular city (more than close to home)



Opinion of friends

Students are pretty happy with their professors ...

82% gave a "excellent" or "good" rating

3.4% gave a "poor" or "horrible"

... it's everything else that needs improvement

- Student life staff = 65% vs. 5%
- Extracurricular Activities = 66% vs. 5%
- Experiential learning = 64% vs. 7%
- Administrative staff = 66% vs. 8%
- Academic advising staff = 66% vs. 10%
 Mental health services = 57% vs. 11%

Percentage of students who feel "X" once a week or more

- Sad: 35%
- Hopeless: 21%
- Overwhelmed: 49%
- Anxious: 54%

Not confident about skills for employment

- Critical thinking and problem solving = 93% vs 6%
- Ability to write clearly = 87% vs. 11%
- Skills and knowledge for employment = 90% vs 9%
